Amanda DeLalla is a NY based writer and actress who currently works at Broadway Licensing. She holds a B.S. in Comm. Arts from St. John's University and is also a proud member of the Dramatists Guild. Onstage roles include Mother (The Oldest Boy), Gilmer (Godspell), and Kiki (Significant Other). As a writer, she is the lyricist and librettist for a musical as well as four full-length dramas and two solo shows. Her work has been presented in a variety of venues, including Lincoln Center, The Tank, Dixon Place, All for One Theater, Snug Harbor, and the Chain Theatre. As a rule, Amanda uses her experiences with living on the autism spectrum to craft stories about emotion and resilience.

Nikki Dos Santos, a graduate from William Esper Studio, is the tough, tried and true New Yorker with a strong moral compass. She brings with her a one of a kind balance of true grit, and vulnerability that can make you shed a tear or two, laugh til ur jaw hurts or even crap ur pants a little.

Her most recent acting roles include Ann Deever (All My Sons) and Patty (Blackout) both at Seaview Playwright's Theatre, as well as Fortinbras (Hamlet) with the Staten Island Shakespearean Theatre Company.

Kseniya Ignatova-Yates * is a poet and playwright living and working in New York City. She has been an active member of the WPC since its inception in 2018. Her work with the collective includes one-act plays Yaffa (2018) and Orbit (2019), as well as her first video piece, Perpetuum Mobile (2020), and 7.05 (2021).

Esmé Maria Ng (they/she) is an early-career, NYC-based playwright, actor, and dramaturg whose work focuses on the complexities of Asian American identity, femininity, and queerness through a decolonial framework. Their plays include A Milk Kind of Play (2020), First Day (2020), I You and We(s): A Collection of Skits (2021), and F***ing Harold (2021). Their work has been independently produced on

virtual platforms and presented by the Snug Harbor Inaugural Porch Plays Festival, the Women's Playwrights Collective of Staten Island, and Wesleyan University. Awards include the Léman Manhattan Excellence in Theater Award and the Wesleyan University Student Script Writers Award (2021). Memberships include: SHADES Student of Color Theater Collective, Ensemble Theater Collective, and the Women's Playwright Collective of Staten Island. Esmé is currently pursuing a Bachelor of the Arts in Theater and American Studies at Wesleyan University.

Holly Pepe has been writing since she could hold a pencil. Her mother relishes telling anyone who will listen about the time she ran out of paper and caught four-year-old Holly writing a book on a stack of coffee filters. She uses a Mac now. Holly has written numerous short stories, poems and essays; additionally, she wrote the novella, "Cruise to Nowhere" and she wrote and directed the one act play, "Pumpkin Soup" with the help of her son Chris. The play was later performed at a Staten Island middle school to raise autism awareness. She is also the author of the novel, Lesson Plans. Since 2005, she has had the privilege of teaching English at Staten Island's New Dorp High School. This past summer, she had the amaing experience of playing Lady Montague and The Apothecary in Staten Island Shake-speare's production of Romeo and Juliet. She is honored and humbled to be a part of the Women's Playwright Collective.
